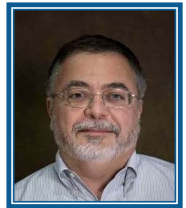

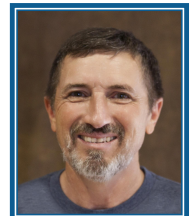

A Message from Father Mike...

BOO!!! (Well, not really)...

Fr. Bert has introduced us into a season of Celebrating the Saints (begun Sunday, September 26; see details in this edition of the Rock Road).

Sunday, October 31, we usually call Halloween. Here's a little more detail. Technically, the Church celebrates October 31 as the Eve of All Hallows (shortened as Halloween). It marks the beginning of a "sacral season" --sacred time, liturgically speaking--called the Octave of All Saints.

"Octave" is from Latin for "eighth"; i.e., the celebration of a feast over an eight-day period. The Eve of All Hallows (Halloween), as mentioned above, introduces the Octave. In its origins, it was the eve of Samhain, a pagan Celtic celebration of the beginning of winter and the first day of the new year. This time of the ingathering of the harvest and the approach of winter provided a reminder of human mortality, a time when the souls of the dead were said to return to their homes.

Bonfires were set on hilltops to frighten away evil spirits. Samhain was a popular festival at the time when the British Isles were converted to Christianity. The Church "adopted" and "baptized", so to speak, this time of celebration for Christian use by observing All Hallows Eve, All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day (October 31, November 1 and November 2).

All Saints' Day is one of the seven principal feasts of the Church Year, and one of the four days recommended for the administration of Holy Baptism (itself, a kind of exorcism, in part, through the renunciation of evil and the remission of sins).

All Souls' Day continues the sacral season as the Commemoration of All Faithful Departed, using the Book of Common Prayer liturgy for The Burial of the Dead. It's properly called a Requiem whereby we commend the dead to the Living God who overcame Death, Hell and the Grave, whose love triumphs over our loss and who hides the baptized one who has "fallen asleep in Christ", to await "the Resurrection of the Body and the life of the world to come", just as the Creed says.

Occasionally, people may ask us about our practice of praying for the dead. They want to know, perhaps, what we can expect of these prayers. We may ask it another way: Is it in any way profitable to those departed souls for whom we pray? is it helpful? Does it change anything? Does it somehow assist the dead who live in the nearer presence of God?

Can they--the saints--help us? Can their intercession (and especially that of the Mother of God), assist us in our transformation in Christ? Are we a Communion of Saints, or not?

Celebrating the Saints might just help us with a deeper understanding and appreciation for why we believe and practice our faith the way we do.

"Be mindful of all those who slumber in the hope of a Resurrection to everlasting life. Give them rest, O God, where the light of Thy countenance shineth." AMEN.

September Vestry Highlights

The Vestry met in Tucker Hall on Monday, September 20, 2021 at 5:30pm. Fr. Bert opened with a prayer, and then a few members of the Vestry shared life and ministry moments.

The Vestry approved the minutes from the August regular meeting. The Vestry also approved the minutes from two actions taken over email to approve job descriptions for the Chancel Choir Director and the Children's and Youth Intern. The August financials had been emailed to the Vestry by the Controller, Kristie Keese. We are 67% through this fiscal year, and the reports showed that our overall income was at 69% and expenses were at 62%. The Chair of the Finance Commission reported that the PPP Loan was officially forgiven. The Vestry approved the financial reports from August.

On behalf of the School Board, Catie Eastland reported to the Vestry. She presented the following highlights from the School Board meeting on September 13, 2021:

School Director's Report:

- The meeting was opened in prayer by Fr. Bert
- Janet Boutin reported that enrollment is at 142. Two kinder students have moved bringing the size of kinder to 16. The school is at capacity at this time.
- A teacher has resigned since the start of school so a floater will be used to fill this vacancy. Janet Boutin is actively looking to fill the floated position.
- New parent orientation was held outdoors on September 10th, and the pictures days are September 22-24.
- The Book Fair is set for October 3rd and 4th: some COVID health guidelines will be in place for the safety of all attending. Time of event is TBA. Open House will be postponed to the spring.
- The school financials continue to remain strong and are well in the positive on the budget.
- The teachers received a pay increase thanks to the grant from the Texas Workforce Commission and these increases are already being paid.
- The next school board meeting will be held October 18, 2021.

Dave Weekley reported the School Financials had been reviewed by the Finance Commission and approved by the School board, remarking that they had a tremendous year. Their income was 139% of the budget and their expenses were only 93%, but there are two unusual items on the income that were not budgeted, a \$105K grant and \$110K in PPP, which skews the income, but if you take those out the are still 108% of budget. Dave remarked this is their fiscal year.

On behalf of the Endowment Board, Carter Crain reported to the Vestry. The Board met prior to the Vestry meeting and discussed more ideas to raise awareness of the Rock of St. Peter's. The Board wants to continue publishing articles in the Rock Road to communicate how the funds help us advance our mission. The Board suggested the idea of including information about the Rock of St. Peter's with end-of-the-year giving statements. Also, Fr. Bert shared how informational meetings pertaining to the Rock could be held in the new fiscal year in conjunction with our vision planning for the next three to five years.

On behalf of the ECW, Amy Richards reported on the following:

- ECW Board meeting will be September 30th and the General Meeting will be October 7th with the program being the Cottage Shop Style Show.
- Nominating Committee working on new Board Officers to present at the October meeting.

Vestry Highlights (cont'd)

- ECW Social Event on Tuesday, August 24th at Tucker Hall at 5:00 p.m. was a great success! Several seasoned and new faces were in attendance.
- Cottage Shop sales continue to be strong!

On behalf of the Organ Rebuild Ad-Hoc Committee, James Horne reported to the Vestry. James Horne reported that he and the committee recently met with David Miron, and the committee was concerned about water in the lower part where the pipes are located, noticing some staining on the floor from water, and the group is trying to figure out where it is coming from.

On behalf of the Labyrinth Guild, Amy Best reported on the following:

St. Peter's Day School worked in conjunction with the Labyrinth Guild to supply decorations for the International Day of Peace. Brochures will be supplied for each student to take home to their parents and all their teachers. Cindy Bachman will be working with Brian Blacklock Sunday, September 19 in Children's Chapel and that she will read from "A Child Walked the Labyrinth" book by another Episcopal Church within our Dioceses (Cindy will also supply a copy to share with the Vestry) and they will send "Peace Like a River" and have the children's Labyrinth in the Chapel for them to walk. Cindy stated both the 24' and children's Labyrinth will be set out in Tucker hall encouraging both indoor and outdoor walks thus the opportunity to attend walks "rain or shine" as now advertised. Cindy will have available for all the PFF group brochures to walk the Labyrinth should they so choose. Fr. Bert approved Ginny to post the International Day of Peach brochure on our email listing to all on the September 17 prior to Sunday of September 19. Paddle fans will be made shortly provided the Labyrinth Guild for all to use and keep individuals that pick one up depicting the artwork produced by Lou Ann Maxwell on one side and information for St. Peter's on the reverse side. These fans will be made available throughout the church at upcoming events. Also, Denise Cartwright is organizing a book sale again to benefit the Labyrinth Build. This has been approved by Fr. Bert and planned for November.

On behalf of the Reopening Subcommittee, Fr. Bert reported that we received a positive response to the letter sent to the parish from the Rector and Vestry coupled with the testament from Alexis and Eric Maloney. Eric Maloney shared a brief report on the status of the city, and the subcommittee will continue to work on behalf of the Vestry to make any further recommendations in terms of protocols.

Amy Richards, Junior Warden, emailed her report to the Vestry. The report included the following:

1. Carport Update: Structure being installed Wednesday, September 22. Guy is looking into having a security light installed as well. Guy has alerted the Tivy House Apartment's owner to make sure no one is parked in the lot on Wednesday and to not allow tenants to block access to the carport.
2. Replacement Trees: Have been planted.
3. AC Units: Installed and in working order
4. Sinkhole in parking lot: the work has been completed and sinkhole repaired.
5. Fire and Security Alarm: Security Alarm and Fire Alarm are installed and in working order for the buildings other than the sanctuary. Guy is working to get a Fire Alarm bid for the church itself.
6. Painting of the Sanctuary: Guy has received 3 bids for painting of the sanctuary that range from \$20K to \$50K. Amy stated she did ask Guy for his feedback since he actually met with the painters, and he has done so. The Vestry discussed the idea of putting the painting of the church on hold for until Vision Planning is finished, in the event that more comprehensive capital improvements are part of the plans.

Vestry Highlights (cont'd)



Mark Haufler, Senior Warden, reported to the Vestry. Mark Haufler reported that the Vision Planning Process has been a “ministry moment” for him. He and others have been a part of two workshops thus far: the Core Values Workshop and the Mission Statement Workshop. Mark feels like these workshops have validated what we are doing as a church. He also looks forward to the parish-wide Day of Visioning on October 16. Mark reported on his work with the Generosity Commission as we move into the fall campaign.

Fr. Bert reported to the Vestry. Fr. Bert echoed Mark’s feelings and assessment of the Vision Planning Process thus far. Fr. Bert also spoke to the Generosity Campaign and invited the Vestry to take on certain responsibilities with the campaign. He provided an overview of the campaign, noting that we will once again provide a generosity devotional to every household in the parish. This year’s devotional is titled *First* by Mike Slaughter and the theme has to do with putting God first in living and giving. Fr. Bert also briefly shared his experience on The Giving Path and how the laity of St. Peter’s and his previous parishes have profoundly shaped his understanding of faithful generosity. Fr. Bert reported on “Back-to-the-Future” Sunday. It appeared to be a successful event in bringing the church family back together for the program year. Fr. Bert reminded the Vestry that Wednesday evening programming will resume on September 22, and he touched on the several programs being offered for children, youth, and adults. Beginning Wednesday, October 6, Fr. Bert will teach a Newcomers Class, and he has already invited ten to twelve families to join that class. Fr. Bert hopes to see more offerings develop for adults on Wednesday evenings, particularly an offering for men to compliment the current Sisters in Scripture program. Fr. Bert is currently working with staff and leaders of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew to see such a program get off the ground. He asked the Vestry to pray for the men in our church, that God may quicken their hearts with devotion to the Lord.

Under New Business, the Vestry elected a Nominating Committee for Vestry and Council Delegate elections. The Nominating Committee includes the outgoing Vestry Members: Carter Crain, Mark Haufler, Amy Richards, and Kathy Voss.

The Vestry and Rector closed their meeting with the Lord’s Prayer, and the meeting was adjourned.

The next regular meeting will be Monday, October 25 at 5:30pm in Tucker Hall. As always, anyone in the parish is welcome to attend. If you wish to be on the agenda and speak, however, please notify the Rector no later than the previous Tuesday, October 19, when he writes the agenda to be sent to the Vestry.

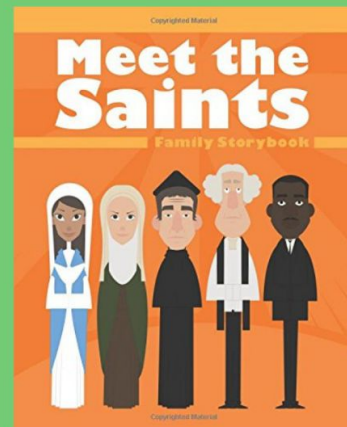

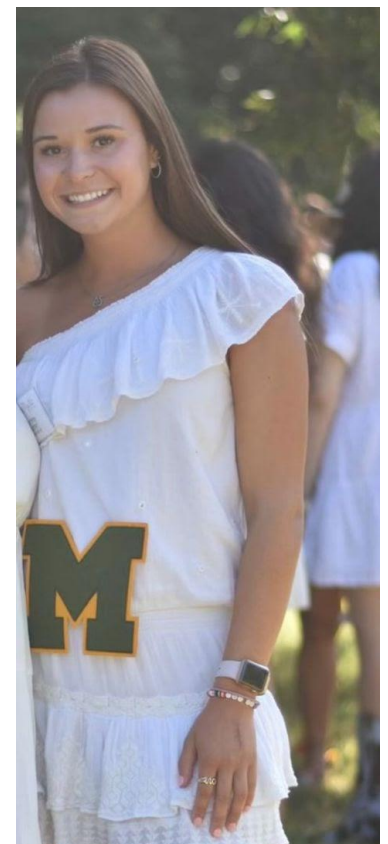
Middle School EYC started the year with a HUGE bang!

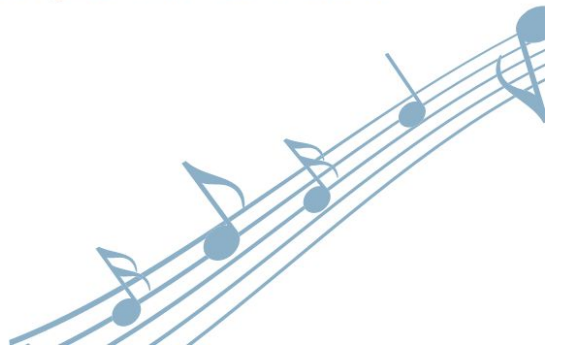
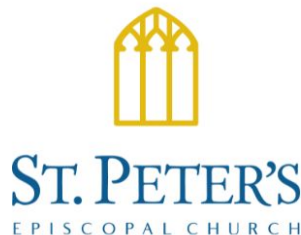
Welcome

In our worship, we join our voices of praise with Angels and Archangels and all the company of heaven. So, who can we identify to be Saints and what exactly is Communion? Join us on Saturday, October 30 to explore these two questions with teachings and discussions led by the Rev. Dr. Nathan G. Jennings, Professor of Liturgics and Anglican Studies and Director of Community Worship at the Seminary of the Southwest in Austin. About the Rev. Nathan G. Jennings, PhD

The Rev. Nathan G. Jennings, PhD, a native of Austin, returned to his hometown when he joined the faculty of Seminary of the Southwest in 2005. Jennings is also the Director of Community Worship and has served as the Chair of the Anglican Studies Program at Seminary of the Southwest since 2008. Jennings is interested in liturgical theology, Christian Platonism, Ancient Near-Eastern studies, asceticism, hermeneutics and the way these disciplines intersect and inform one another.

His first book, *Theology as Ascetic Act: Disciplining Christian Discourse*, published in 2010, represents a light revision of his doctoral dissertation and argues that Christian teaching and reflection are embodied acts analogous to, and part of, Christian asceticism. His second book, *Liturgy and Theology, Economy and Reality*, Wipf and Stock 2017, argues for a Christian metaphysical realism, presenting liturgy as a cosmic gift economy whereby God renders cosmos out of chaos. He is currently working on a book that will provide an outline of sound liturgical decision-making. In teaching, Jennings reflects on liturgy theologically as that which enables participation in God and God's work in the world. In addition to the required liturgy and Anglican studies courses, Jennings offers elective seminars in Liturgical Theology, Hermeneutics, and occasional seminars on Anglican Divines.

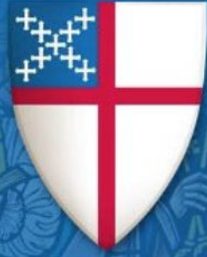

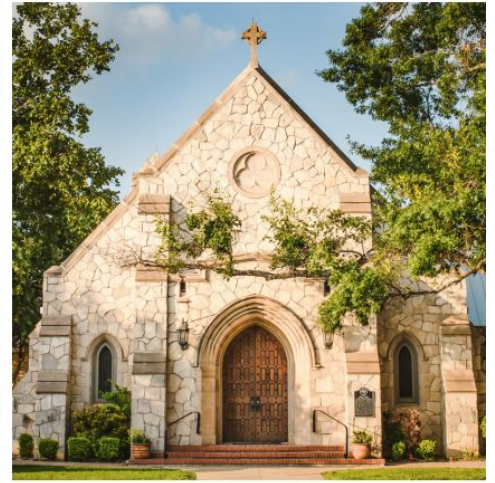

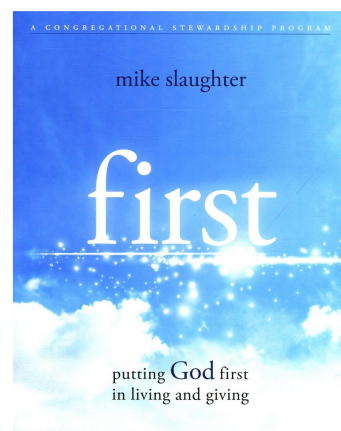

Prayer at the Beginning of a Labyrinth Walk

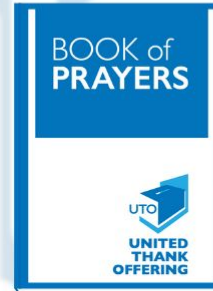
Alone in Your sight

Diocesan Protocols and Guidelines

Bishop Reed issued guidelines in May 2021 providing us room to begin lifting certain restrictions and revising our protocols. In anticipation of Sunday worship, the Vestry then approved the following protocols, which remain in use at this time:

- Fully vaccinated individuals are no longer *required* to wear a mask or physically distance indoors or outdoors on church premises.
- Masks and 6-foot distancing are expected and strongly encouraged for individuals who are *not fully vaccinated* indoors.
- We have resumed passing the offertory plates
- We are using the pew kneelers during worship.
- Almost all pews are now available for seating. A front section of the Nave will continue to offer space for distancing, should you wish.
- We are using the altar rail when taking Communion, and wine will be offered by intinction.

Other changes to our protocols will be made known as they are available.

Would you like us to bring Holy Eucharist to your home?

We would be glad to bring you Holy Communion at your convenience. You are an integral member of our church family, and we want you to be able to share in our sacramental life at St. Peter's.

Our Eucharistic Visitors are ready to bring Holy Communion to your home. They will follow all safety protocols to keep you safe. They will stay on the porch or come inside, whichever you would prefer. They will check in with you, share what is going on at church, pray with you, and then safely share with you the consecrated bread.

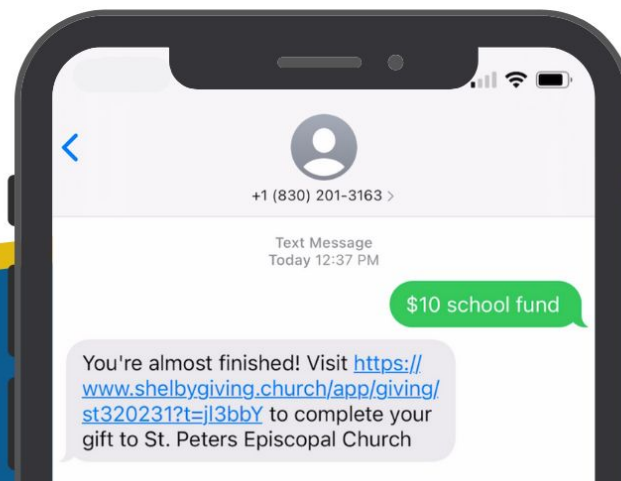

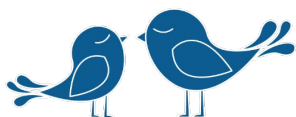
