The Epiphany season celebrates the revelation of Christ's divinity—notably in the visit of the Magi to the Christ child. The Magi came and they saw. So too are we invited to come and see that and other moments of epiphany as they were imagined and depicted in Medieval and Renaissance art. In addition to simply enjoying some great art and engaging with important events in Christ's life, we will likely consider such topics as the role art played (and plays) in the life of the Church, the development of that art over time, and the traditions and symbolism artists called upon.



There will be four sessions, each devoted to one or more moments of epiphany:

Feb. 2: The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. Luke 2:22-40

Feb. 9: The Visit of the Magi. Matthew 2:1-12

Feb. 16: The Baptism of Jesus; and The First Miracle, at the Wedding at Cana. Matthew 3:13-17, Mark 1:9-11, Luke 3:21-23; John 2:1-11

Feb. 23: The Transfiguration, The Supper at Emmaus, and The Incredulity of St. Thomas. Matthew 17:1-9, Mark 9:2-8, Luke 9:28-36
