Do we stop and hear music? Do we ever pass by and miss the chance to behold truth and beauty in the Christ among us? In our own Baptismal Covenant, we promise to seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbors as ourselves. By virtue of our baptism, we have an opportunity to see another person with the eyes of our hearts enlightened. We can remember one of the richest stories in Luke's Gospel. But, clearly important to the story, the two disciples do not know it is Jesus Christ upon first glance. He is a stranger to them, but they seek and serve the stranger. The disciples invite the stranger into their home, and Jesus is revealed to them in the breaking of the bread. Certainly this was music to their ears.

January Vestry Highlights

The Vestry met on Monday, January 13, 2020 at 5:30pm. Fr. Bert opened the meeting with a prayer, and then several members of the Vestry shared life and ministry moments.

The Vestry approved the minutes from the regular December meeting.

The December financials had been emailed to the Vestry by the Controller, Kristie Keese. The financials had also been reviewed by the Finance Commission. The reports showed that our overall income was at 108% and expenses were at 102%. The financial report was approved by the Vestry.

On behalf of St. Peter's Episcopal School, Dee Elliott reported to the Vestry. Dee reported that current enrollment is at 140 students (capacity is 141). School registration for the year 2020-21 will begin in February, with Priority Registration beginning February 18th-21st, Church Registration beginning February 24th-28th, and Open Registration March 2nd-6th. The school has numerous activities planned for the spring semester, including the Spring Fling, which will be held on May 18th at the Cailloux Theater. The City of Kerrville will soon be putting up signs that designate the area around St. Peter's to be a School Zone. The school would like to be able to dispose of the old school bus that is no longer used. The Vestry moved to allow the school to dispose of the school bus at their discretion.

Mickey Horany, Stewardship Commission Chair, reported to the Vestry. Mickey reported that 189 Estimate of Giving cards have been returned to the church since Taking the Next Step Sunday, and that he plans to deliver a final report to parishioners at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 26th. To date, the total Estimate of Giving is \$762,320.

Lou Ann Maxwell, member of the Vestry and Delegates Nominating Committee, reported to the Vestry. Lou Ann shared the names of the nominees for election to the Vestry: Richard Eastland, Bob Kinnan, Eric Maloney, and Nellwyn Sadler. Lou Ann also presented the slate of nominees to represent our parish at Diocesan Council. Subsequent to the meeting, the Vestry elected the following delegates for Diocesan Council: Amy Best, Jana Drane, Lisa Earl, Richard Eastland, Mark Haufler, Polly Horany, and Richard Mosty. The Vestry then elected the following alternates for Diocesan Council: Stephen Drane, Doug Holmes, Mickey Horany, Amy Ives, Betty Mosty, Susan Parker, and Kathy Voss.

David Martin reported on the plan for capital repairs and improvements. David reported that he has met with a roofing contractor, and he hopes to meet with one more to get another bid for the roof repairs. David also plans to give a summary report at the Annual Meeting.

David Martin also reported on behalf of the Junior Warden, Stephen Drane. He reported that the organ rebuild continues, and the waterproofing has been completed. The church bell repairs are also completed, and Brian Blacklock will be coordinating the ringing of the bells with Fr. Bert, Fr. Mike, and the acolyte masters. The MacDonald Companies continue to oversee the maintenance of the Jefferson Manor Apartments. The construction of a storage building and workshop will possibly begin this spring, if all goes according to plan.

Lou Ann Maxwell, Senior Warden, reported to the Vestry. Lou Ann reported that an agreement between the church and school has been drafted with input from the Rector, the Senior Warden, School Board President, the School Director, and last year's School Board President. The agreement the will protect the interests of both, and the agreement is ready to be presented to the Chancellor Richard Mosty for his review. Once Richard Mosty has reviewed the agreement, the agreement will be shared with the School Board and the Vestry for final approval. Lou Ann also reported on a couple of other items of business related to payments from a bequest to the church and church-owned mineral rights.

Fr. Bert reported to the Vestry. Fr. Bert reported on his work with both adults and youth for Confirmation. He is teaching his Episcopal Way class for adults on Wednesday evenings in January and February. He is also asking the youth preparing for Confirmation to read My Faith, My Life and then meet with him on February 23 to discuss their reading and questions about the book. Fr. Bert reminded the Vestry about the Vestry Retreat with the Rev. Mike Besson. The retreat will be at Camp Capers on February 7 and 8. Fr. Bert also reported

to the Vestry that the Lenten Series is planned with five good speakers, and this year's series is based on the Seven Last Words of Christ. Each speaker will have an opportunity to share what would be his or her last words, if in fact, he or she had one last message to share.

Under New Business, updated expenditure and authorizations policies were presented to the Vestry for review and approval. The presented policies were accepted by the Vestry. Also, under New Business, the Vestry decided not to designate a percentage of the diocesan apportionment to the budget of the Episcopal Church or toward mission work outside the Diocese of West Texas.

Under Old Business, the Vestry reviewed the 2020 operating budget and approved the budget as presented.

The Vestry and Rector closed their January 13 meeting with the Lord's Prayer. The meeting was then adjourned.

The Vestry also met on Sunday, January 26, immediately following the Annual Meeting. The newly elected members of the Vestry are Richard Eastland, Bob Kinnan, Eric Maloney, and Nellwyn Sadler. At the Annual Meeting, the Rector announced his appointment of Mickey Horany as Senior Warden. At the January 26 Vestry meeting, the Vestry elected Mark Haufler as School Board Liaison, Kathy Voss as Secretary, David Martin as Junior Warden, and Richard Mosty as Chancellor. The meeting was then adjourned.

The next regular meeting will be Tuesday, February 18, at 5:30pm in the Multipurpose Room of Tucker Hall. As always, anyone in the parish is welcome to attend. If you wish to be on the agenda and speak, however, please notify the Rector no later than the previous Tuesday, February 11, when he writes the agenda and then sends the agenda to the Vestry.



The Epiphany season celebrates the revelation of Christ's divinity—notably in the visit of the Magi to the Christ child. The Magi came and they saw. So too are we invited to come and see that and other moments of epiphany as they were imagined and depicted in Medieval and Renaissance art. In addition to simply enjoying some great art and engaging with important events in Christ's life, we will likely consider such topics as the role art played (and plays) in the life of the Church, the development of that art over time, and the traditions and symbolism artists called upon.



There will be four sessions, each devoted to one or more moments of epiphany:

- Feb. 2: The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. Luke 2:22-40
- Feb. 9: The Visit of the Magi. Matthew 2:1-12
- Feb. 16: The Baptism of Jesus; and The First Miracle, at the Wedding at Cana.

Feb. 23: The Transfiguration, The Supper at Emmaus, and The Incredulity of St.Thomas.





Checking In Before They Check Out

A Communal Approach to Faith

The Surgeon General claims our culture is experiencing a "Loneliness Epidemic." *The Gospel Coalition* claims that "Americans are lonelier than ever, even though opportunities for social connection have exponentially increased." In a world of inexpensive travel and pocket-sized communication devices, how did isolation become such a prevalent trend?

Community in our western culture is in sharp decline and the young hearts and minds sitting in our pews are bombarded with the ideology of radical individualism. Our culture claims that we need autonomy and self-esteem, but I propose that we are actually hard-wired for deep, relational connection.

Jesus perfectly models this disposition throughout his life and ministry. He was never *not* in relationship. He did not enter this world by splitting the heavens and floating down. He gently grew in Mary's womb, interacting with adults as a child and began his ministry by inviting others to follow him. Even on the night before his crucifixion, he shared a meal with his disciples and asked them to join him at Gethsemane as he prayed.

On occasion Jesus left his disciples to pray in solitude, but even in those occasions he was not alone. He was in communion with the Heavenly Father. If relationships were essential to Christ, shouldn't they be important to us as well?

The church observed Jesus' actions and heeded Scripture's instruction to "consider how to stir up one another towards love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some." Subsequently, the Lord's Prayer, our creeds and liturgy are littered with plural pronouns which should indicate a human necessity for deep, relational connection.

So now what? We have identified a cultural problem. We have observed its ecclesiological relevance and must now, with the Lord's blessing, make an effort to improve upon our current culture.

Does this mean that you have to teach a Sunday School class? Lead a small group in your home? Volunteer for a youth lock-in? While these opportunities *DO* exist, there are also ones that take *much* less preparation. Take, for example, the discipline of "showing up with a smile." Greet the widow sitting in the pew next to you. Share the peace with the obnoxious kid squirming in the seat behind you. Ask how their week was and actually listen for their answer! Let us not forget that we are *ALL* made in the image of God and possess intrinsic value.

This spring our parish's Daughter's of the King and Brotherhood of St. Andrew commit to intentionally build community across generational lines. The men and women of St. Peter's will share their passions and hobbies with our students, along with great stories of joy and pain. We refuse to accept loneliness and commit to building relationships....ONE smile at a time!
