It is hard to believe that one month of school is already over! We have had a great start and we have enjoyed getting to know your children. It is amazing how quickly the children have settled into their school routine.

The age of COVID has changed so much at school but, I hope you see the joy, love and commitment the children are experiencing. Many of you have sent kind emails and notes expressing your gratitude and appreciation of the School. Thank you for your kindness and patience!

Many lessons have been learned this month but, most of all, it is the promise we must all have to keep our students and staff healthy and safe. We want to keep our school operating at a high quality for all. Here are some requests.

- 1. If you travel out of state, contact the School. Our traveling families are staying home 3 days to self quarantine and then return to school.
- 2. If you or any member of your family is home sick with fever, keep all the kids home until COVID and flu are ruled out.
- 3. Avoid large gatherings, play dates and parties whenever possible.
- 4. Above all else: in public places wear a face mask, practice social distancing and plenty of handwashing.

At St. Peter's School, we are committed to everyone's safety. Our teachers always wear masks/shields indoors. We also work to clean commonly touched surfaces on a regular basis. Our teachers and custodial team use extra precautions to sanitize toys and clean the classrooms. Also, every weekend disinfectant foggers are set off in every classroom. We never use aerosols, vacuum or use harsh cleaning supplies around the children. All major disinfecting occurs after hours for the protection of our young developing children. We also strive to use eco-friendly products when possible.

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
Update: School Zone Times
